Tighter CLO spreads eyed; Symphony CLO XII prices \$832.5 million; CLO loan holdings flat

Tupelo, Miss., Sept. 27 -Collateralized loan obligation spreads are predicted to tighten before the year is over, according to a market source.

CLO spreads were quoted on Friday in the 140 basis points area for AAA-rated notes. In the rest of the capital structure, AA-rated notes were seen in the 200 bps area; A-rated tranches at the 340 bps area; BBB-rated tranches in the 440 bps area and BB-rated notes in the 650 bps area, according to Wells Fargo Securities, LLC.

"We do believe that mezzanine spreads will tighten and see the possibility of 75 bps-100 bps of potential tightening in primary BBB and BB tranche spreads," Dave Preston, a Wells Fargo analyst, said in a note.

The tightest levels for BBB-rated and BB-rated spreads were about 350 bps and 550 bps, respectively, in late May, he said. In new issuance, Symphony Asset

Management LLC brought its second deal of the year with an \$832.5 million CLO that priced the AAA-rated slice at Libor plus 130 bps and the tranche at the bottom of the capital stack at 515 bps, according to a market source.

Symphony taps market

Palmer Square Capital plans 'pattern of serial' CLO issuance, focuses on 2.0 CLO investments

Tupelo, Miss., Sept. 27 - Palmer Square Capital Management LLC, which closed the previous week on its second collateralized loan obligation, intends to be an active manager and investor in the CLO market, Christopher Long, president of Palmer Square Capital Management, said in an interview on Friday.

"Depending on market conditions, our hope is to continue and really have a pattern of serial issuance in the CLO

space," he said. "We feel fortunate that we had really good execution. The difficulty people are experiencing in the market has really intensified since we priced our second deal."

New issue AAA spreads have widened to the Libor plus 140 basis points area as CLO investors demand higher spreads due to a thin number of AAA-note investors and the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp.'s April 1 assessment charge for banks, according to market sources.

Symphony CLO XII prices \$832.5 million of notes in eight tranches

Tupelo, Miss., Sept. 27 – Symphony Asset Management LLC priced an \$832.5 million collateralized loan obligation offering of notes due Oct. 15, 2025, according to a market source.

In the deal, Symphony CLO XII, Ltd./Symphony CLO XII LLC sold \$500 million of class A senior floatingrate notes (//AAA) at Libor plus 130 basis points; \$61 million of class B-1 senior floating-rate notes at Libor plus 175 bps; \$45 million of 4.08% class B-2 senior fixedrate notes; \$47 million of class C deferrable floating-rate notes at Libor plus 275 bps; \$51 million of class D deferrable floating-rate notes at Libor plus 350 bps; \$34 million of class E deferrable floating-rate notes at Libor plus 490 bps; \$21 million of class F deferrable floating-rate notes at Libor plus 515 bps and \$73.5 million of subordinated notes.

BofA Merrill Lynch was the placement agent for the transaction, which is expected to close on Oct. 24.

The notes have a two-year non-call

period and a four-year reinvestment period.

The CLO is backed primarily by firstlien senior secured corporate loans.

Proceeds from the deal will be used to purchase a portfolio of about \$800 million of primarily senior secured leveraged loans.

The Symphony CLO XII is the second CLO priced in 2013 by Symphony Asset Management, a San Francisco-based asset management firm that manages about 10 CLOs. The firm brought the \$827.5 million Symphony CLO XI Ltd. transaction in February.

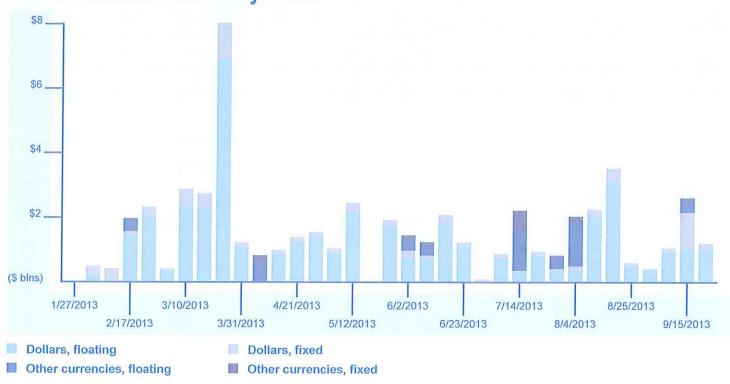

Palmer Square CLO 2013-2, LLC sold \$463.8 million of notes due Aug. 15, 2025 in eight parts in its second CLO, which closed on Sept. 17.

The CLO priced with spreads that ranged from Libor plus 140 bps at the top of the capital structure to Libor plus 615 bps on the lower-rated slice, according to market sources.

In April, the Palmer Square CLO 2013-1, Ltd. priced the AAA-rated slice at Libor plus 125 bps and the B-rated notes at a spread of Libor plus 650 bps.

Investor activity is strong in the mezzanine pieces of CLOs, Long said.

"The spreads on those on a relative value basis are still really strong, and we've seen that translate into a lot of investor demand for the bottom part of the cap stack," Long said. "Despite some of the challenges facing the triple A portion of

the capital stack, new issuance of deals has still been pretty robust. In addition, from a secondary standpoint, there definitely also have been places to take advantage of opportunity."

Currently, Palmer Square Capital is focused on investing across the CLO capital structure in 2.0 CLOs, which are post-financial crisis structures. CLOs brought before 2007 are referred to as 1.0 version CLOs.

"We're investors in everything from triple A down to CLO equity," Long said. "We really like the bottom part of the stack currently. As far as the 1.0 [CLOs], we have not been doing much, at least not recently."

Palmer Square Capital Management's two CLOs invest primarily in institutional senior secured bank loans.

The Leawood, Kan.-based investment

management firm, which also focuses on other areas, including structured corporate credit and high-yield bonds, has added three new members for CLO operations and senior credit analytical positions this year.

Looking forward, Palmer Square Capital Management is well positioned were the much-talked about 5% risk retention requirement to go into effect, according to Long.

The comment period on the risk retention requirement for CLO managers to retain 5% of the deal, part of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, expires on Oct. 30. The requirement would become effective two years after the final rule is published.

"We feel like that's actually something, on a relative basis, [that] will be a nonevent for the CLO management part of our business," Long said.

Caesars sets final pricing; Aptalis downsizes, widens spread talk; Getty loans move lower

Portland, Ore., Sept. 27 – Cash loans were unchanged on thin volume, a trader said on Friday afternoon.

The LCDX20 index of bank loan credit default swaps finished the session at 103 5/8 bid, 104 1/8 offered, down 1/4.

The loan paper of **Getty Images** continued a downward arc seen throughout the past week, according to a trader, who marked them 89 bid, 89³/₄ offered, down 2 points from Wednesday's close.

The new loan paper of Allegion U.S. Holding Co. was par bid, par ½ offered on Friday, the trader said. The \$500 million Libor plus 225 basis points seven-year term loan B was priced at 99.75.

And the **Information Resources Inc.** seven-year covenant-light term loan B

was par bid, the trader said, adding that the \$617.5 million was issued at 99.5.

In a relatively quiet primary market Caesars Entertainment Resort Properties, LLC set final pricing on its downsized \$2.5 billion first-lien term loan at Libor plus 600 bps. The deal allocates on Monday.

And **Aptalis Pharma Inc.** downsized its seven-year term loan B to \$1.25 billion from \$1.4 billion, also cutting its planned dividend by \$150 million.

Allegion U.S. Holding priced its upsized \$500 million Libor plus 225 bps seven-year term loan B at 99.75, and the deal traded to par bid, par ½ offered, a market source said on Friday.

The loan was upsized to \$500 million from \$300 million with the downsizing of the senior unsecured notes offering.

The CLO market continues to keep pace as the loan market has grown 18% over the past year, with CLOs maintaining a 46% to 52% share of the market, Bradley Rogoff, an analyst with Barclays, said in a note on Friday.

About \$57 billion of CLOs have priced

year to date and have surpassed 2012 issuance, sources said.

"We estimate that CLOs currently hold \$280-320 billion in U.S. loans, making their share of the asset class unchanged [year over year] at 46-52%," Rogoff said. "Although CLO creation has been robust this year, it has slowed somewhat since an FDIC rule change on April 1 that made it more expensive for banks to hold AAA tranches."
